Our Mission

Tainan Art Museum is dedicated to creating a professional art museum with excellent performance based on the principle of independent administrative institution. The mission focuses on collecting and conducting research on Taiwan’s modern and contemporary artworks, as well as reconstructing the development and orientations of art in Taiwan. The museum hopes to build cultural consensus among all citizens through promotional events and aesthetic education, in order to enrich the art and culture in Tainan, as well as boosting the city’s competitiveness.

Our Vision

The museum adds a brand-new cultural symbol and style to the city by transcending the past, present, and future. It inspires the creativity of Tainan that is both traditional and cutting-edge, while exploring the meaning of modern times through initiating dialogue between new and the old. To further enhance the significance and value of local art, exhibitions and art promotion campaigns are held to build cultural consensus, improve the aesthetic taste of citizens, bring art into everyday life, and bring about LOHAS participation, aiming to be a museum for all citizens with international vision. Diversified interpretations of Taiwan's art history

The museum continues to explore culture and art in Tainan to strengthen the local vision of culture, as well as revitalizing history and enhancing the general public’s understanding of their own culture and identity through research on Taiwan's art history.

The museum further introduces exhibitions and artists from abroad through international collaboration to connect Tainan to the world and enhance the city’s cultural competitiveness.

The museum continues to defend the concept of equal rights, popularize aesthetic education and take social responsibilities to create a museum for people of all backgrounds and ages.

It has been five years since Tainan Art Museum (TAM) opened its doors to the public. As the first independent administrative art museum in Taiwan, it continues to enhance the cultural heritage of Tainan by creating a space allowing diverse cross-generational dialogues among different communities that keep up with the modern pace of life to develop a new style of culture.

Message from Former Director

Tainan Art Museum has always taken on a multi-angle business approach to implement the vision and goal of an administrative institution, continuing to achieve good results and gaining public attention. In 2022 we held 30 exhibitions, in particular, *Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art and Transcendental Visions: Ko Si-Chi's Art Works* were ranked 3rd and 7th separately in Artist Magazine’s list of the 10 best exhibitions of 2022.

This year, the museum acquired and was gifted a total of 220 works of art and completed two research commissions on the subject of oil painter Wong Kung-De and Contemporary photography in Tainan. The Museum's Art Conservation Scientific Research Center not only conducted 19 cases of works inside and outside the museum, but also cooperated with the Graduate Institute of Conservation of Cultural Relics and Museology of TNUA to conduct off-site teaching courses, continuing to deepen the connection between the museum and the university in the professional field.

In addition to exhibitions, the museum also held highly acclaimed events like the Cubic Party, Vienna Oktoberfest, Open-air Cinema, *Break out from Hell* Midnight Cosplay Event, and collaborated with nearby businesses to create the Art+ing Open Door events. This year not only saw the return of the Moriyama Bazaar, but the museum also cooperated with the National Museum of Marine Biology and Aquarium to exhibit *Come Across the NMMBA in the City*, which continued to bring art into the public’s eye.

To promote art education and fulfill the museum's social responsibility, the museum continued to hold lectures, workshops for children's art education, activities for the elderly with dementia, and several joint programs with neighboring schools to bring art to schools. In addition, the museum has designed fun and educational thematic camps such as English guided tours, architecture, and picture books. In addition, with a generous donation of NT\$.1 million from the band Mayday, the museum has created a multi-functional Co-Learning space and an M & M recording studio in Building 1, providing future educational displays, interactive experiences, workshops, audio-visual productions, and independent activities.

The Tainan Art Museum delivered a fruitful report card for 2022, continuing to increase the visibility of Taiwanese artists and keeping Tainan in the international spotlight.

Selected for the 8th Public Art Awards

Break out from Hell, The Underworld in Asian Art Cosplay Event

The museum specially hosted 3 midnight cosplay events for the exhibition *Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art*. Guests get to partake in photoshoots, games, and visit the exhibition at night for a limited 3 nights. The event saw 364 guests and 36 KOL groups, which successfully marketed towards different target groups to the museum.



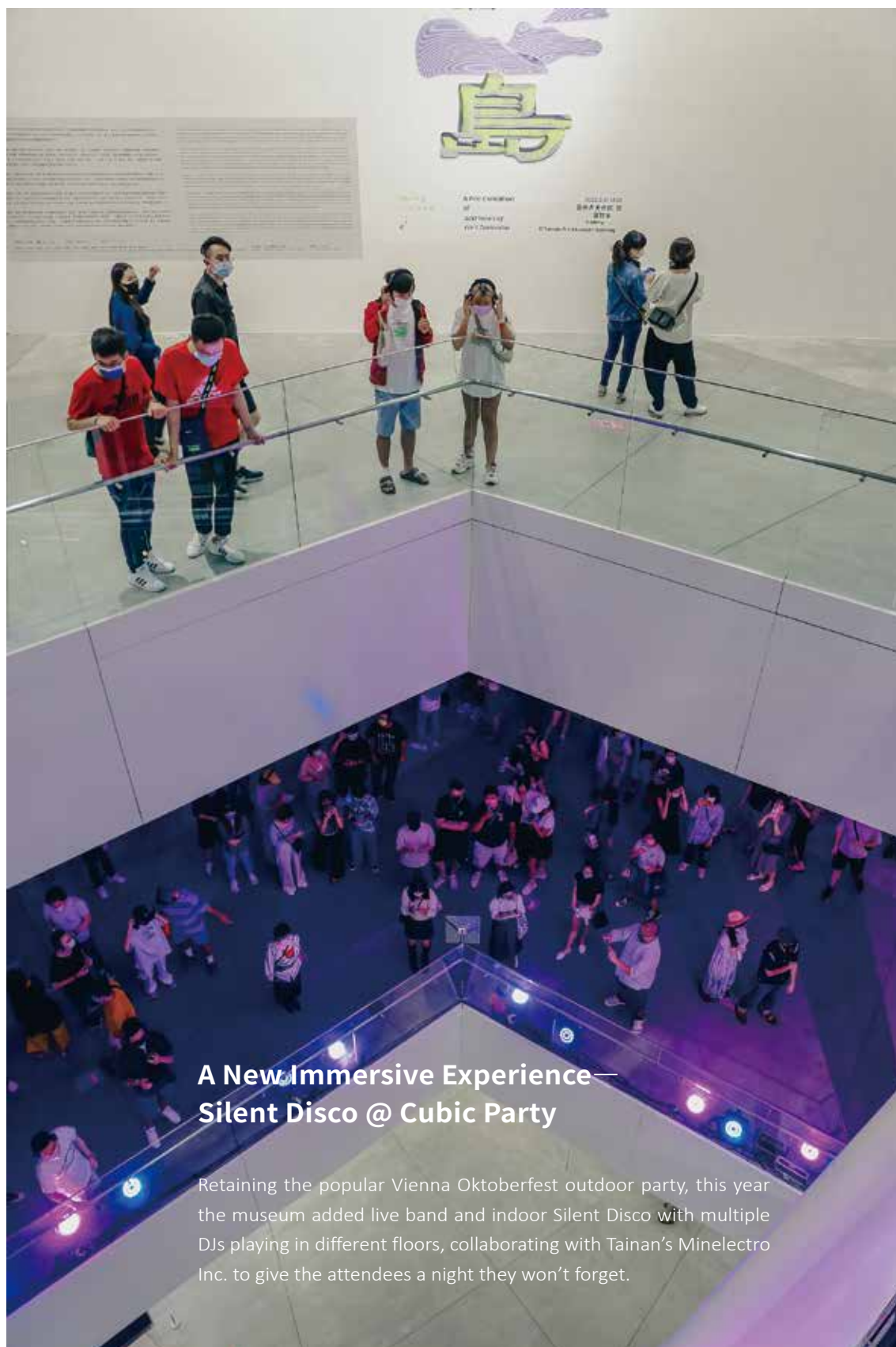
Hatching Dreams on Treetops, Co-Learning Space

The Co-Learning Space was made possible thanks to donation by the band Mayday, Yunfeifan Museum, and Sunfar Education Foundation. The space is used for education, exhibition, interaction, and relaxation. The current theme of the space is *Hatching Dreams on Treetops*, an exhibition that stimulate viewers to think about their dreams and goals.

M&M Studio

The recording studio was also donated by the band Mayday that can host 4 people in the recording booth. The museum uses this studio to make exhibition guide recordings and promotion videos, and plans to open the studio for rent to the public in the future.





Archiving and Assorting Collections in Storage

2022 marked the completion of the 850-piece inventory assorted and uploaded to the Ministry of Culture Collections System. 420 art works were also transported from the Cultural Affairs Bureau of the Tainan City Government Yunhua warehouse to the museum. The collections from 2018 to 2022 were then consecutively underwent the process of preventative pesticide fumigation, dusting and cleaning, collection photography, deterioration examination, marking of inventory number, record of storage unit, shelving, and other storage preparations.

Exhibition

The Museum curated and presented a total of 14 special exhibitions, 1 museum permanent collection exhibition, 8 applied exhibitions, and 7 exhibitions continued from 2021 for a total of 30 exhibitions in 2022.

Despite the hardships of the pandemic, the Museum still managed to open international exhibitions including collaborating with the musée du quai Branly-Jacques Chirac to present the *Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art* and *Persistence/Resistance: Taiwan – Canada Indigenous Art Exhibition* which was a collaboration with the Canadian Trade Office in Taipei.

Tainan Art Museum not only hopes to become an international showcase for the city, but also continues to move toward the construction of Taiwan's art history. This year, the museum organized important artists and related issues in Taiwan and Tainan, for example, *Transcendental Visions: Ko Si-Chi's Art Works*, *Tshuà Tsháu-jû: Myth, Stage and the Backlit Fort Provintia*, *Charting a Kun Island- a pre-exhibition of "400 years of Fort Zeelandia,"* and *Sunten Treasures: Gathering and Sharing*. There were also contemporary exhibitions like *Multiple Copies - Readable Multiplex Landscape*, *Orientation of Daily Life: A Biopsy of Our Life*, and *SHERO—Taiwan Contemporary Women Artists*.

In terms of external cooperation, the museum has cooperated with Tainan National University of the Arts, National Taiwan Craft Research and Development Institute, Tainan City Architects Association, and Tainan Culture Foundation to organize special exhibitions on the themes of picturebooks, crafts, architecture, and fashion to attract different target groups to come and enjoy.





Exhibitions Reconstructing Taiwan Art History

Transcendental Visions: Ko Si-Chi's Art Works

2022.04.02~09.11

Ranked 7th in Artist Magazine's list of the 10 best exhibitions of 2022

The exhibition curated by the Tainan Art Museum is the first-ever large-scale solo exhibition held for KO Si-chi in his hometown of Tainan. This exhibition starts from the context of photography and presents the stylistic construction and photographic expression of KO's works at different stages. These works span across his entire career, from early inception, the establishment of his aesthetic style, his realistic portrait photography, to his most iconic works created in Europe and North Africa, including the most celebrated dye transfer works. In addition to his photographic works, this exhibition also provides a glimpse into the photographer's creative life and artistic process by showcasing many of his work items, like various types of negative prints, daily life photos, cameras, and other documents and materials.





Tshuà Tsháu-Jû: Myth, Stage and the Backlit Fort Provincia

2022.04.02~09.11

The artist' family was generous by gifting the museum 85 works after the exhibition.

TSai Tsao-Ju's Taiwanese name is Tshuà Tsháu-Jû. The exhibition is presented in two stages: the preview part and the main part. The two-part exhibition presents a complete collection of Tshuà's temple architecture paintings and landscape and figure sketches from various periods. The selected works cover a wide range, including mythology and drama characters painted from the perspective of a director with profound sinological knowledge and archaeological spirit. The exhibition attempts to present the intellectual rational and sensual nature of Tshuà Tsháu-Jû's artworks, which combine knowledge and talent with the spirit of innovation and heritage.



Charting a Kun island- a pre-exhibition of "400 years of Fort Zeelandia"

This exhibition is a precursor to 2024's exhibition "400 Years of Fort Zeelandia." It calls for the inhabitants of the island to imagine what life will be like in the future as Taiwan marks its 400th year as a participant in world history. The exhibition is divided into three main sections: "Regression, Transgression," "Civilization, Ecology" and "Kun Island, No Boundaries." It contemplates the transformations of the island's landscape in relation to nature and economic trade, providing some food for thought for the audience as they reflect on the future direction of Taiwan.

Sunten Treasures: Gathering and Sharing

2022.09.29~2023.02.12

Constructing Taiwan's art history is one of Tainan Art Museum's key missions. For this exhibition, more than 100 pieces were selected from the Sun Ten Collection and arranged thematically under the core of inclusive Taiwanese cultural heritage. Through the proper arrangement of the treasures Dr. HSU Hong-yen left behind, the exhibition aims to guide the audience in finding a beautiful path to acquaint themselves with fine arts development in Taiwan. Tainan Art Museum aims to grasp the passage of time in a complex and rapidly changing environment, just as the Museum works hard to find old art classics' new value.

Collection Exhibitions



SHERO— Taiwan Contemporary Women Artists 2022.10.29 ~ 2023.02.28

SHERO: Taiwan Contemporary Women Artists is the first exhibition focusing exclusively on the works of women artists in the Tainan Art Museum's collection since the museum opened in January 2019. From creation and display to discussion and interpretation, this exhibition reflects the artists' diverse orientations and development, highlighting their dual identity as women and artists. It also reveals how they have continued to innovate despite the challenges and constraints that society at large imposes on their everyday life. The museum also invited Expert lecture and artist talks during the exhibition run.



Painting in the Southern Breeze: The Artist Room of CHEN Cheng-Po, KUO Po-Chuan, HSU Wu-Yung and SHEN Che-Tsai

The artist room continued to showcase works by CHEN Cheng-Po, KUO Po-Chuan, HSU Wu-Yung and SHEN Che-Tsai as a gateway to understanding important Tainan artists. In August of 2022 the Artist Room is renewed with 37 new art works including some on loan from CHEN Cheng-Po Cultural Foundation.



Contemporary Visions

Multiple Copies - Readable Multiplex Landscape

2022.01.06~05.15

In this exhibition the artists try to question our attitude and thoughts about life in the present time of multiple existences and body extension through their works. In this process, how do we define subjectivity? When technology and the internet would no longer be the mainstream tool for the purpose of domination, and we have to return to the physical entity, were we still complete?



Crossover Crafts. Values and Practices. Mix and Regeneration

2022.03.03~06.05

The exhibition is a collaboration with National Taiwan Craft Research and Development Institute. The title of the exhibition represents three dimensions which are time, space, and speed. Artists explore the unknown field through crossover process, the artworks are not only what they see, but also how they deeply feel. A performance art called the Crossover Crafts Lab is hosted during the exhibition to enable audiences a closer look at the ongoing performance of crafts.





Architecture : Di-Stances in-between, 2022 Tainan Architecture Triennial

2022.03.17~08.21

2022 Golden Pin Design Award- Integration Design

Partnering with Tainan Architects Association, the triennial exhibition combines the city government, Chiaoyu and other private construction groups to create an interdisciplinary curation through design. This art action point to the distances between different individuals and their own neighborhood. The purpose is to interpret architecture in a broader sense, to understand that architecture is an integral part of the way of life.

Orientation of Daily Life: A Biopsy of Our Life

2022.08.02~02.05

Serving as a platform for daily life reinterpretation and self-cognition establishment, this exhibition attempts to connect viewers' life experiences through visual culture with three subthemes, namely "positioning", "normality" and "gathering and dispersing". The tour route on site allows visitors to appreciate the exhibits alternately at different distances and mentally perceive the surrounding physical environment, through which they can examine the roles they play as well as their relationships and interactions with others in daily life.



International Exhibitions

Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art

Ranked 3rd in Artist Magazine's list of the 10 best exhibitions of 2022

Ghosts And Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art was presented by the musée du quai Branly - Jacques Chirac in 2018, featuring traditional artifacts, artworks, and latest pop cultural works. The exhibition takes an insightful look at fears and imaginations of the unknown world in Asia over the centuries. Through curator Julien Rousseau, visitors in Taiwan can rethink their cultural experiences from a new perspective. The Taiwan edition of the exhibition aims to respond to the narrative of the original exhibition and to include works by Taiwan's contemporary artists and film posters of local ghost and monsters. The exhibition also presents collections from the National Museum of Taiwan History and Xuejia Ciji Temple, reflecting the temple culture and legends of Tainan and to provide a richer knowledge of ghosts and monsters from the local cultures.



**Persistence/Resistance: Taiwan –
Canada Indigenous Art Exhibition**
2022.09.08~01.29

Co-organized by Tainan Art Museum and Canadian Trade Office in Taipei, the exhibition displayed 30 artworks from the Indigenous Art Centre of CIRNAC. Several local indigenous artists were also invited to showcase their works in the exhibition to present diverse perspectives. The exhibition also explored the ways of restoring relations and creating more opportunities for dialogue as indigenous communities Taiwan and Canada address multi-faceted issues they face, including history, transformation, land ownership, economic development, and culture preservation.

ImageNation: The Wonderland of Picture Books

The picture book is a form of true art. It is not merely to facilitate the process of reading for children or even adults but has its implicit influence that has subconsciously changed how visual graphics is perceived and appreciated as well as its interaction with the world. Featuring various examples which contextualize the transition of its practice, the exhibition offers an insightful view on how the picture book is formed and developed as well as its impact on the graphic culture and illustration industry in Taiwan.

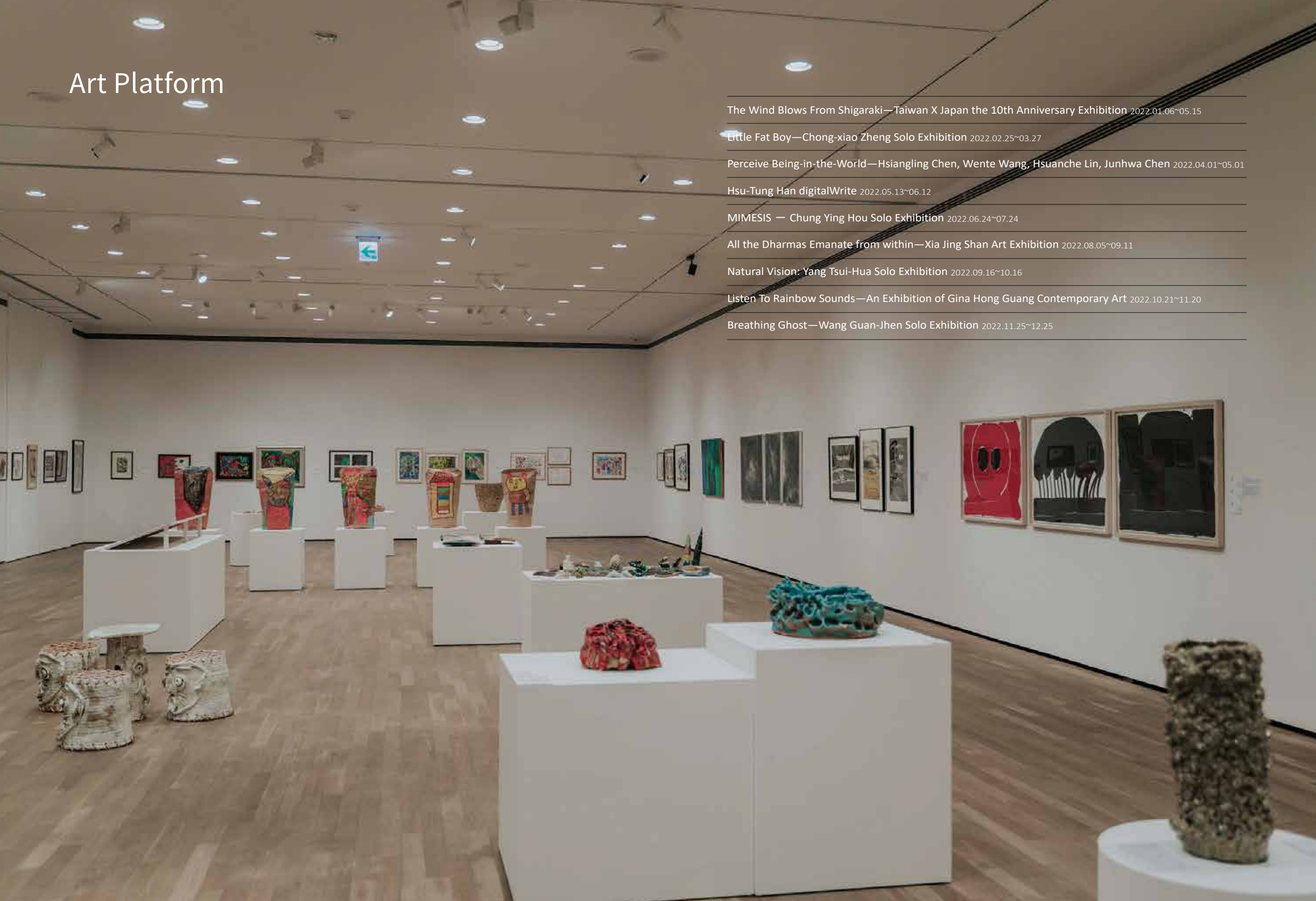


Encounter: Indigenous National Living Treasures Meet Fashion

Organized by Tainan Culture Foundation, the exhibition featured 52 garments co-created by 5 outstanding Indigenous craftsmen certified by the Ministry of Culture and 5 fashion designers. The apparel displayed in this event highlighted the interplay between creativity of the designers and exquisite craftsmanship of the indigenous living treasures for exploration of new possibilities in indigenous art. 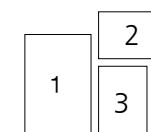
Collection and Conservation



The museum's collection focuses on modern and contemporary artworks in the context of Tainan's regional development, including paintings and calligraphy dating back to the Ming and Qing Dynasties, works influenced by Western or other ideological trends from the Japanese occupation to the post-war period, and works that transformed Tainan's local traditional art into artistic creations.

The museum collected a total of 220 works in 2022, including acquired a total of 23 works from artists KO Si-Chi, PAN Yuan-Shih, LIAO Shiou-Ping, CHEN Huei-Tung, LIAO Ching-Chang, HOU Chung-Ming, CAI Wei-Ren, and CHANG Ken-Yao. A total of 197 works of art were gifted including works by KUO Po-Chuan, CHEN Huei-Tung, HUNG Cheng-Ren, PAN Li-Shui, PAN Chun-Yuan, CHEN Po-I, SHEN Che-Tsai, TSAI Tsao-Ju, HOU Li-Ren. The media used includes oil painting, photography, printmaking, mixed media, new media, Eastern Gouache, charcoal, watercolor, and ink.

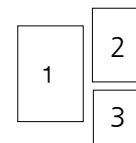

Research

Taiwan Treatise on Art Research Project

Two commissioned research projects were completed; The life and works of painter WONG Kung-De (1915-1995). Receiving permission to translate WONG's diary from 1970 to 1990, the museum was able to look at the assorted documents for the first time ever. The second is Comprehensive Tainan Photography Research 1920-2022; 29 artists and 200 works were researched and analyzed in regard to the style and relation in the museum collection.

2022 Conference on Taiwanese Art History: Rethinking the Landscape—Landscape Painting and Photography in Postwar Taiwan

The conference discussed how Taiwan artists faced the changing political climate, emigration to Taiwan, and international uncertainty and how it interacts with the new scenery in this country. YEN Chuan-Ying was invited as guest speaker on the topic "The Calling of the Views of Taiwan's Mountain and Sea." Nearly 100 people joined in the conference and including online viewers a total of 160 people participated.

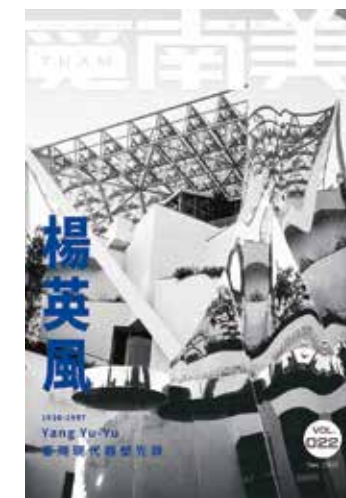

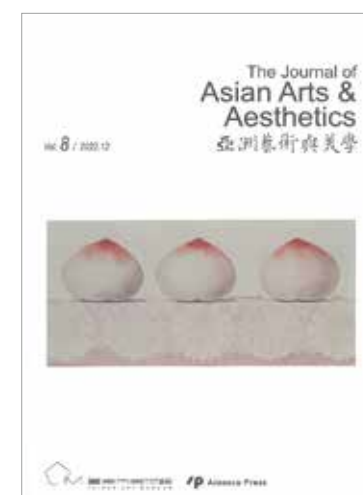

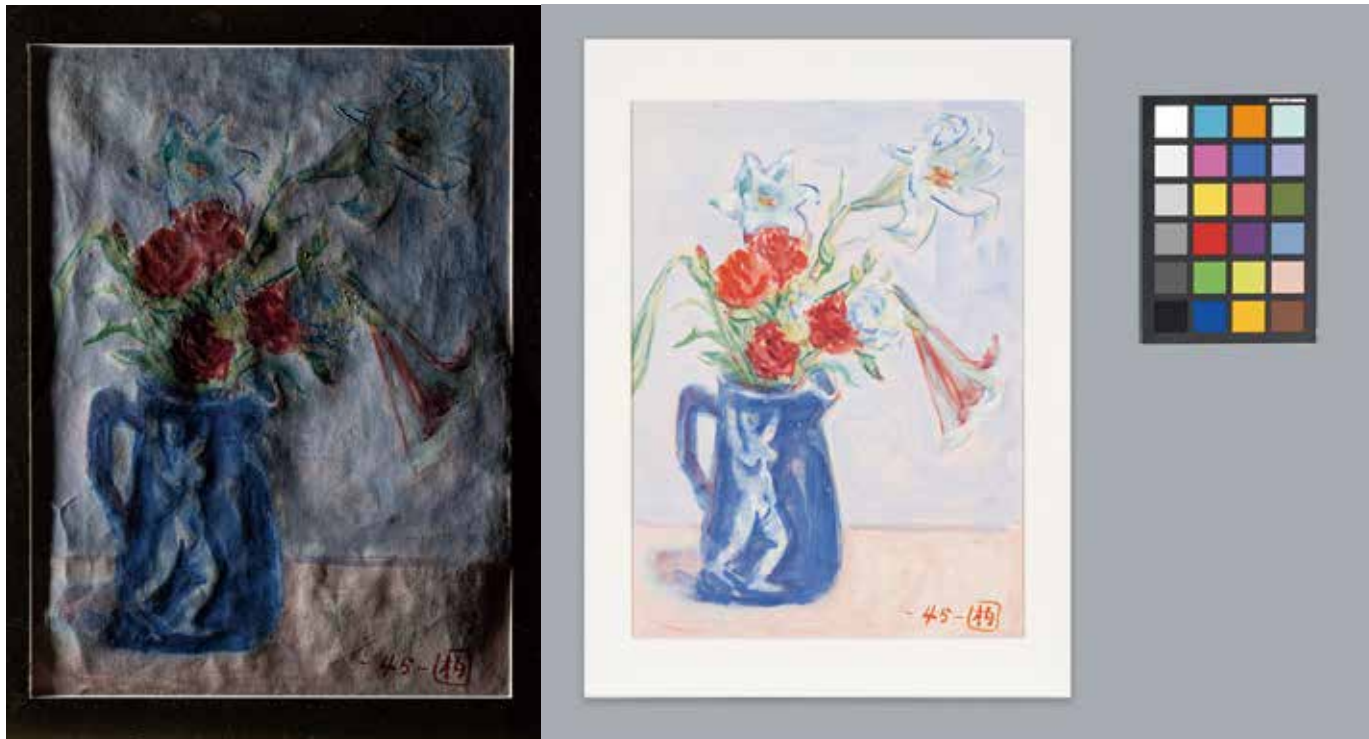
Art Conservation and Scientific Research Center (ACSRC)

Art Conservation and Scientific Research Center integrates art historical research and conservation work with scientific methods to build a science-based view of Taiwan's art history. E.Sun Foundation continued to support the museum with NT\$1 million to conserve the museum's collection this year. Combined with additional support from the Ministry of Culture, the museum added 11 internal conservation cases (32 pieces) and completed 28 works. There were also 8 external cases (5 pieces) added for a total of 19 conservation cases and 25 works in 2022.

Conservation on the Collection

1. KUO Po-Chuan's *Lilies in the Vase*

The right side of the painting was deformed and protruded out of the window mat, and the center of the painting is glued to the backing, which will cause brittleness and discoloration of the paper over time. The original frame and backing were first removed, then the backing tape was removed with a hot air pencil, and the residual glue was removed with pigskin glue, finally the window mat was made with acid-free paperboard.

2. YANG Wei-Lin, *The Rhetoric of Indigotic Rags*

The Rhetoric of Indigotic Rags is a contemporary textile that has 8 separate pieces mainly includes cotton fabric, embroidery, pearls and shells, and steel. This piece was cleaned for residue glue and rust, and a special case was made for storage after the exhibition.

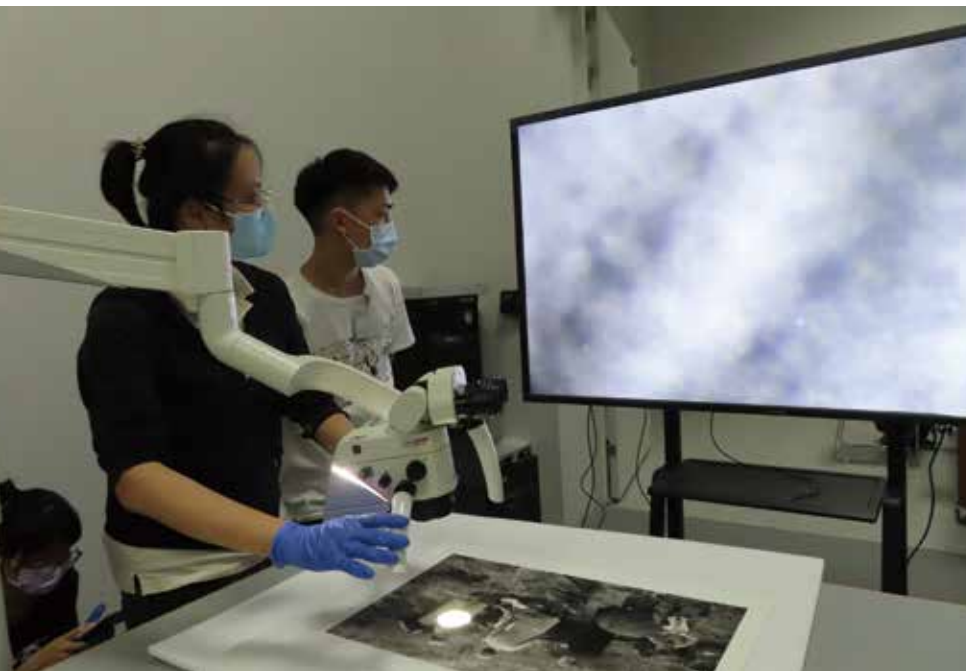

Scientific Analysis

Material natural aging experiment—In progress

In addition to further understanding the characteristics of the material changes, the experiment can be further tried in the future to age samples of common paints, adhesives, and other art materials on the market, to build up a database of art-related materials and to provide information on the aging of the materials.

Education

With exhibitions as the core, a variety of activities such as guided tours, special lectures, field trips, and artistic creation were held in 2022. In terms of promoting museum-school cooperation, the museum combined different courses and activities of schools in the surrounding areas to introduce TAM to the students. The museum also takes advantage of the learning resources to organize a children's creative workshop together with the E.Sun Foundation. The museum takes part in the Cultural Aesthetics Trip Initiative of the Ministry of Education, giving teachers and students free access to guided tours and creative experience at the museum. Reading and children's art exploration public welfare activities are organized together with the Sanfar Education Foundation. In response to the trend of aging society, the "Place in My Heart" initiative was launched to provide art appreciation and creative activities for the elderly and elders with dementia.

The "Co-learning Experience Area – Hatching Dreams in the Treetops" was sponsored by Mayday, Remarkable Cultivation Museum and Sanfar Education Foundation, as a multi-functional space for exhibitions and parent-child interactions. Several well-received camps were also launched, with professional teachers spending a fruitful time with the students. For example, the team of conservators in the museum helped the students experience the mystery of cultural relics restoration. Students from the 6th grade to college freshmen also participated in the guided tour camp from which they learnt how to introduce the works by classic artists from southern Taiwan in English.

A total of 8 events were organized based on festivals such as theme activities for the Lantern Festival, Art Festival, Children's Day and Mother's Day, including the 3rd "Vienna Art Festival." There are more than 700 volunteers at TAM and they are the most important pillar of the museum. They are responsible for the maintenance of the exhibition hall and guided tours. TAM continues to create a friendly environment by providing the audience with a variety of friendly and accessible services to share the beauty of art with the audience.

Special Exhibition Themed Events

Lectures Dedicated to the Exhibition of Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art 3 lectures

TAM worked with Academia Sinica and domestic scholars and experts in literature and history to arrange lectures on topics including “Ghosts in Taiwan – Black Dwarves, Shuiliu Gong and Goryo on Lambai Island”, “Taiwan’s Folk Belief in Ghosts: Punishing the Vicious and Evil and the Ghosts under the God’s Judicial System,” and “Hell on Earth: the Relationship between the Construction of the Ancient Ghost World and the Secular Society.” A total of 310 people participated in the three lectures.

Lectures Dedicated to the Exhibition of Architecture : Di-Stances in-between, 2022 Tainan Architecture Triennial 8 lectures

Several dedicated events were co-organized together with the Tainan City Architects Association, leading the public to re-measure the distance between people and objects/spaces/buildings/streets/cities, to feel the relationship between life and architecture. A total of 486 people participated in 8 lectures.

Lectures Dedicated to the Exhibition of Transcendental Visions: Ko Si-Chi's Art Works 2 lectures

KO Si-Chi's wife FAN Jie-Shi and scholars of art and photography history including HSIAO Chong-Ray, JIANG Li-Hua, SHEN Bo-Cheng were invited to give lectures on the characteristics of Ko's works and the importance to the development of photography in Taiwan. A total of 255 people took part in the 2 lectures.

Fun with Master Craftsmen - Craft Demonstration Activities 3 sessions

The museum worked with the National Taiwan Craft Research and Development Institute to organize craftsman demonstrations and practices on the themes of “space,” “time” and “speed” with a total of 81 people in 3 sessions.

E.Sun Foundation Play ARTs Children's Creative Workshop 6 sessions

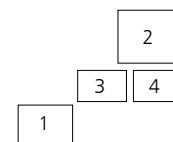
This program was co-organized with E.Sun Foundation for the second time with elementary school children from the south visiting TAM, including art making activities, special exhibitions and architecture guided tours, etc.

"Museum of Light - Architectural Model" Workshop

The children observed light in the museum designed by Shigeru Ban, listening to the architectural stories of light, understanding how light is presented in architecture, and how architects bring light and shadow into architecture through their designs. They looked for the footprints of light through real-life exploration and made a light museum model by hand.

Co-organized the "Wash Everything Away, Waves!" Children's Art Exploration Activity

The museum worked with the "Sanfa Education Foundation" to organize public welfare activities. Lecturers of "Cháu Lãi Cháu Khi Art Studio" led children to imagine the past of the coastline around the base of the museum. "Opening the TAM Box: Scientific Art Experience - Young Pioneers of Cultural Relics Protection" Winter Camp 2 days

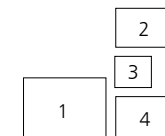
Lecturers from the Art Conservation and Scientific Research Center of the museum allowed the students to learn basic conservation knowledge, understand conservation, scientific testing, panchromatic and complementary color principles, etc., integrating the conservation of cultural relics into daily life. The session had 14 participants.

Opening the TAM Box - English Guided Camps 2 sessions

The museum launched an age-specific English guided summer camp. Lectures from MEET UP FORMASA taught the students from 6th grade to 7th grade, and students from the 9th grade to 10th grade to college freshmen in two stages. They practiced speaking English with confidence, as well as developing an in-depth understanding of the classic works of painters. Each session lasted 3 days with a total of 30 people for two sessions.

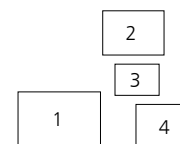
Harvest for the Year of Tiger: Block Printing for Lunar New Year Celebration

The museum hosted the first edition of Vienna Art Festival in 2020, and it was the third edition this year. Looking forward to the 2024 Tainan 400th-anniversary large-scale celebrations, TAM warmed up with various types of cross-disciplinary activities focusing on cultural highlights and expanding the diversity of art and cultural performances in the museum to showcase the rich urban cultural vitality of Tainan.

The museum continued to co-host with the Tainan City Government Tourism Bureau, the Department of Cultural Affairs and Austrian Office Taipei. With current exhibitions as the core, cross-disciplinary dialogues and exchange were organized across four fields including music (Romantic Southland Concert, Romantic Dance Concert, Silent Disco), food (Vienna Oktoberfest), movies (outdoor cinema: *Grandma and Her Ghosts* and *Ça Fait Si Longtemps*) and new media art (Tricky Women International Animation Film Festival screening).

CHUNG Yung-Feng, LIN Sheng-Xiang Music Recital

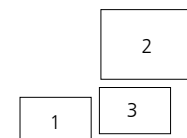

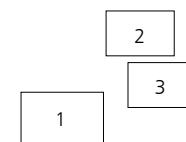
Institute of Art Studies, National Cheng Kung University "History and collection of art museums and modern curatorship"

Marketing & Promotion

In 2022, all our new attempts brought new excitement whether it was connecting the new and the old, the virtual and the real, local and global, or venturing out of the exhibition hall. TAM took a succession of stress tests to change the perspective of citizens, from working with KOLs, Moriyama Bazaar 4.0, outdoor dynamic performance for Taipei Fashion Week, as well as popular exhibitions including the Yoshitomo Nara Exhibition in Taiwan and Ghosts and Hells: The Underworld in Asian Art. TAM also organized 3 midnight Cosplay sessions in the museum. The different forms of event helped attract people from different fields enter the museum, as well as changing the general public's imagination of the museum. The different interpretation allowed the visitors to get closer to the pieces and resonate with them. Exhibitions were no longer difficult to understand with the museum promoting exhibition themes, art-enterprise cooperation, exhibitions of well-known international artists, festivals, and media marketing and so on to create a museum for all. Tainan's art development will enter the next stage with the platform for international exchange, bringing local art to the next stage and into realms that had been unreachable in the past.

Collaborative Events



2022 ART+ing

ART+ing took advantage of the extension of the pentagonal Building 2 to design an “art map” that gathers nearby partner stores. This year, the official Line account was employed to enhance the fun of participation by solving puzzles.

Incense Art Experience Workshop 7/16

Pass on the culture of incense art by providing people with experience in the production of incense cone, incense sticks and incense coils.

In addition to the music video itself, the aesthetic features of the architecture of Buildings 1 and 2 were also incorporated. The video was showcased on different media channels such as Facebook and the news to boost the visibility of the museum.



National Museum of Marine Biology and Aquarium

The 3rd Taiwan Science Festival saw *Come Across the NMMBA in the City* Exhibiting in Tainan Art Museum from October 27th to November 13th, around 10 thousand people visited.

Moriyama Bazaar 4.0

Moriyama Bazaar was held at TAM for the fourth year. As all large-scale events in the West Central District of Tainan, it must tackle the challenges of traffic and the crowd. In 2022, many temple fairs and festivals in the surrounding area were organized at the same time with great success thanks to measures such as cross-agency communications, shuttle buses and parking lots from neighborhood schools. In addition, TAM developed a fast-track ticket package sales services, providing another option for the public to enter the museum with ease. It was also an innovative attempt to expand and increase self-funding in addition to venue rentals. A total of 533 ticket packages were sold this time and increasing the number of visitors by 1066 over two days.

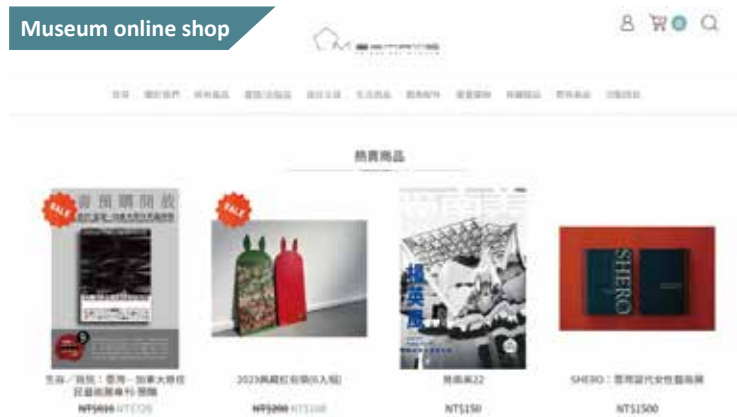
Merchandise & Shop

The number of works in this museum's collection is relatively small compared with other museums. Fortunately, it has received a lot of support from the artists for the authorization and development of cultural and creative products. Co-branding with local private enterprises and a member online shopping platform, the products add value to special exhibition works and collections, as well as optimizing product launch, page layout, member introduction, payment linking and marketing. Discounts are also given to boost online store orders from 16 in January to May to 16 in a single week in June, showing good results. TAM developed 23 merchandise focusing on special exhibitions and archived collections, with a total turnover of NT\$4.5 million, increasing the overall annual operating income by 80% compared with previous years.

Social Media

There were a total of 3,189 stories, including press releases issued by TAM, media reports and post-visit reports. There were 18 stories in international media, 38 annual media topics, and visits from more than 150 media companies.

On June 12, the photo of the exhibition hall of Musée du quai Branly Jacques-Chirac in France generated a lot of shares and media attention. The museum interacted with the public in a simple and easily understandable way. The museum's Facebook page has over 100,000 fans, with the total number of fans increased by 110% compared with last year. The total number of reach was 7,416,991, an increase of 350% compared to the same period last year. The total number of interactions on Facebook was 4,301,373, an increase of 737% compared to the same period last year. Instagram also saw a 134% growth compared to last year. The "Exhibition Visit with Your Ears at TAM" continued this year with the iListen app to create 10 episodes integrating the spirit of art in everyday life. The click-through rate continued to rank in the top ten chart from July to October.

Membership Management

In 2022, 36 cards were issued for a cumulation of 188 members. As for annual donations, 11 donations were made in goods, with an accumulated amount of \$177,370. 25 donations were made with an accumulated amount of \$3,380,000, for a total of \$4,007,370.

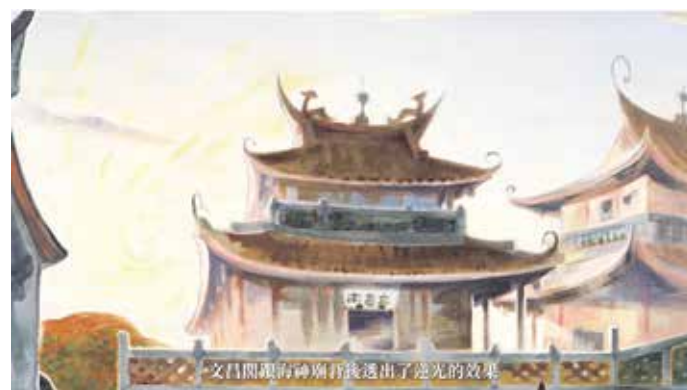

Tainan Art Museum Festival

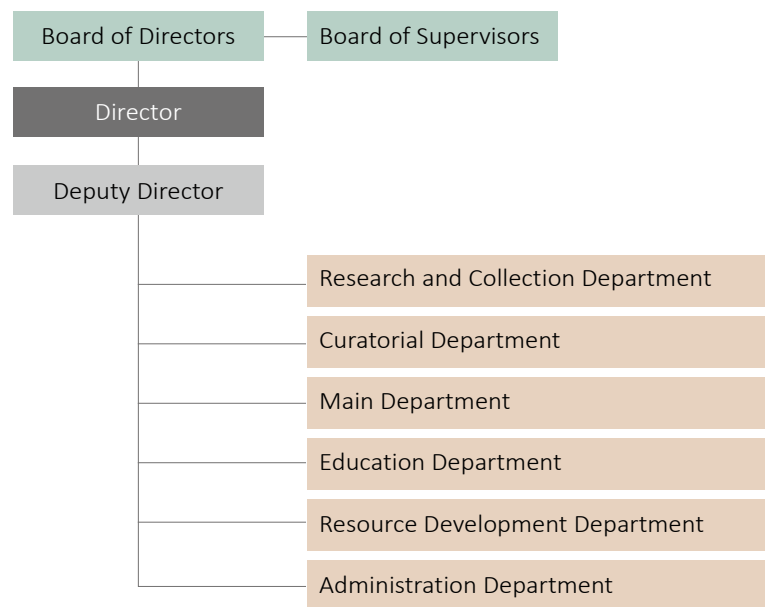

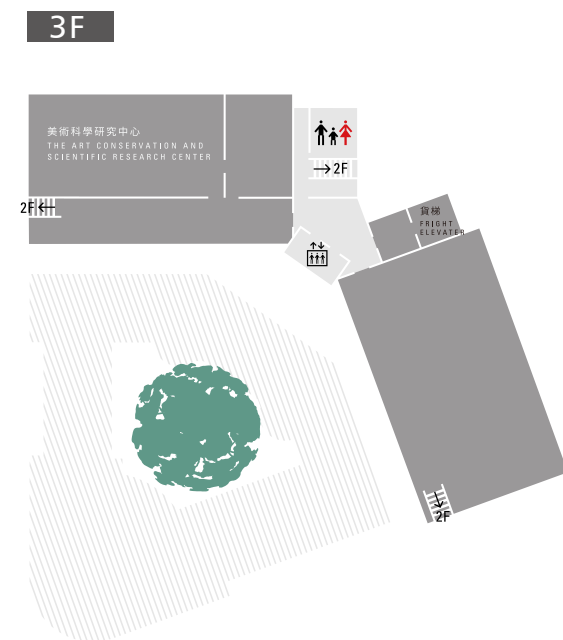

Facilities

Building 1 of Tainan Art Museum used to be Tainan's main police station, designed by Japanese architect Sutejiro Umezawa and completed in 1931. A reinforced concrete structure - the outer walls of the two wings- are covered by thirteen ditch bricks, which is a distinctive building material found in other buildings from the period. Everyone remembered the building to be red until the original colors of the bricks were rediscovered during the museum's restoration. To make the building more suitable as an exhibition space, three new floors were added to the rear of the original building and connected by a central glass corridor, making the exhibition space of Building 1 to 1,553 m² in total. Building 1 consists of 10 exhibition rooms, Café, collection area, and the Art Conservation and Scientific Research Center.

Constructed on the site of the Public 11 underground parking lot, the building strengthens the original building structure of the underground parking lot. Erected above the site is a five-story building with a pentagon-shaped roof inspired by the Royal poinciana flower, the official tree of Tainan city. Under the magnificent roof, a series of vertical and stacked spaces form to create a free touring route of the museum. The many semi-outdoor platforms created by this unique shape also provides numerous rest and activity spaces. The specially engineered Sierpinski triangle fractal shaped panels hang on the ceiling to keep the building cool from direct sunlight and cast a shadow like that of ones through tree leaves. The total exhibition space of Building 2 is around 2,700 m², consisting of sixteen exhibition rooms, collection area, a performing arts theatre, a children's art center, a studio, a museum gift shop, Café and a scenic restaurant.

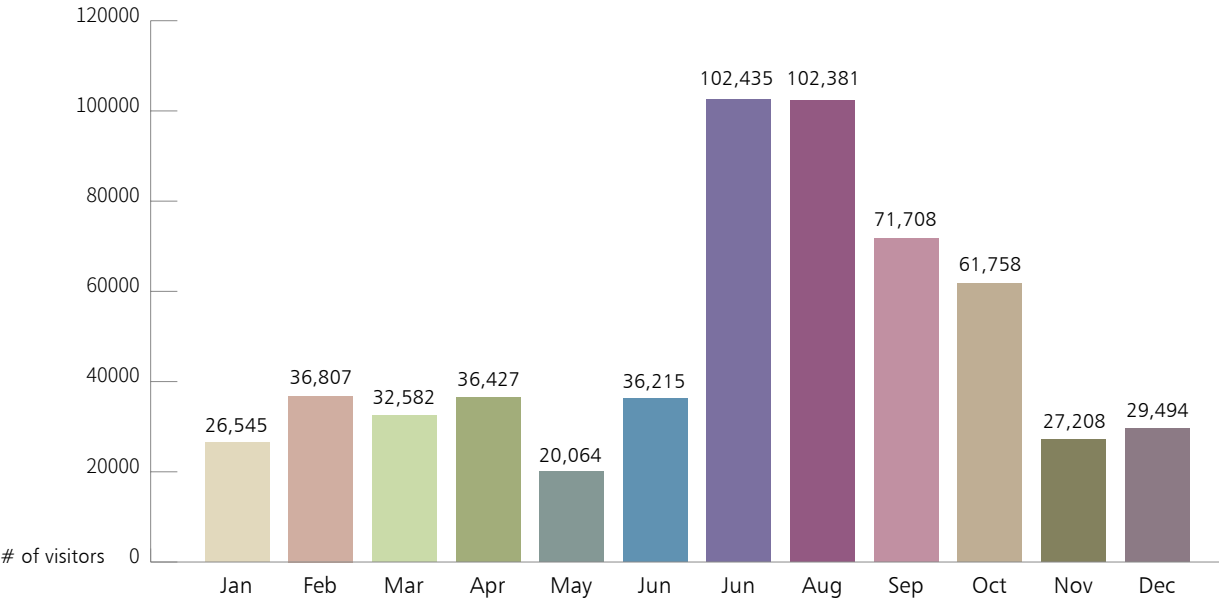
Visitor Figures
